# LONG TERM REPAIR / ROOF



\$1,400,000.00 goal \$555,907.38 received

Update as of 2-8-2021

Total Pledges: 121

We currently have a bid for a new roof at \$1.4 million. Our roof committee was unanimous in the decision to go with a steel roof. We are excited about moving forward with this option and know that our church and school will benefit from it for many years to come.

We have set an agaressive timeline for the funding of this campaign. The Diocese has a policy that states a church may only sign a contract for capital improvements when 75% of the cash needed is in hand and 100% is accounted for in pledges. NOTE FROM FATHER CRAIG TIMMERMAN... You are beloved! You are beloved! Today is Valentine's Day and World Marriage Day! There is no greater love than the love of Our Lord, and married couples are a sign of that love, "That is why a man leaves father and mother and clings to his wife and the two of them become one body. This is a great mystery. I mean this in reference to Christ and His Church." (Eph 5:31-32). We are in the days of Mardi Gras, a French celebration before we enter the fast of Lent! So celebrate with your love today! On Wednesday we begin Lent with Ash Wednesday. We will distribute ashes like they do in Europe: sprinkling them on our heads. Our Bishops asked us to use this option this year. It still 'counts'! I added a Mass time for Ash Wednesday at noon so everyone can come. Lent and Easter is the most sacred time of the year for us as Catholics. I want to again invite you to return to Mass if you have not already done so this year. Perhaps you have the vaccine already and can now choose to come back. Church is safe. There have been no known outbreaks from church services when protocols were followed. This will be a very special Lent, as we prepare to celebrate Holy Week. We missed it so much last year. I encourage you to really take up this Lent with great fervor. 1) fast and abstinence: Not only follow the Lenten rules, which are really very easy, but give up anything that makes you focus more on the world than on God: desserts/candy, screen time/TV, social media, attitudes of complaining/criticizing, surrender what you need to trust more fully to God. 2) works of mercy: With the pandemic, there are so many opportunities to reach out to our neighbors in need: visit to isolated ones, help homeless, an anonymous gift certificate for food/gas, pray for those who have died. 3) prayer: increase vour prayer for Lent. I especially want to invite everyone to come to Stations of the Cross on Fridays here. They are a favorite of mine. I prayed them right after Bishop let me know I was coming here to this AFC of Sts. Peter and Paul. You will notice some provisional Stations put up in the main Church. We will pray the stations there on Fridays. I hope you will attend with your families. I remember attending with my family growing up. It always made an impression on me to walk the way of the cross with Our Lord. I will also offer confessions right after stations. Other ideas for prayer: take up the Rosary, Divine Mercy chaplet, perhaps a daily reflection through Word on Fire or Dynamic Catholic or Ascension Press or Fr. Mike Schmitz Bible in a Year. 4) Confession: Many people came back to confession last Advent. I was very honored by this. If you haven't yet gone since before the pandemic, please go! This is a basic precept of our faith during Lent, so we are prepared to receive the Eucharist at Easter worthily (that is, without serious sin on my soul). I love to bring the Lord's Mercy to people in this Sacrament.

Lastly, remember Deacon Tony and I are doing the Lenten series on Sunday after 10AM Mass on the Lamb's Supper. You will love it! The books are in the entryway to pick up and start reading. We will begin next Sunday, Feb. 21st. Know my prayers for you all in this holy season. You are beloved!


