Dear Parishioners,

The recent Pastoral Leader Days were very good. We had two groups of presentations. Tuesday's focused on porn addiction and the damage that it can do to families, as well as the necessary 'talk therapy' for help out of the addiction. Dr. Peter Kleponis was the presenter and has a great website at http://www.integrityrestored.com/ as well as http://www.maritalhealing.com/. There are a number of great resources there. Wednesday morning's presenters were Bruce and Jeannie Hannemann of RECLAiM Ministries (http://reclaimsexualhealth.com/), which helps those with addiction physically heal. There is great evidence that online pornography, especially consumed in large amounts, literally causes damage to the brain, leading to a lower intelligence, communication skills, and socialization. This is on top of the spiritual damage as well as the psychological. They have an online course that uses the neuroscience and new understanding of the neuro-placity of the brain to help those with problems find healing and hope.

Sadly, the issue with pornography is bigger than I suspect. It is a \$13 billion dollar industry in the US, with 50% of Christian men and 20% of Christian women saying they are addicted to porn, and 56% of divorces have porn as a key component to the breakdown of marriage. The speakers also shared that the stereotypically porn addict is not correct – the average addict is intelligent, sensitive, and spiritual. As Pope John Paul II said about porn, though, is not that it reveals too much of a person, but that it reveals too little. While our culture keeps saying that it is all okay, everything medically, psychologically, emotionally says otherwise. Please, if you have problems, use the sacrament of Reconciliation, or check out the above websites. There is no reason to hide from the Lord – He desires your healing. You are made for more! Our faith offers the very best – we have the sacrament of Reconciliation as well as the Eucharist – the most intimate reception of our Lord who meets our every need and heals our every wound. The presenters even shared that doctors examining a man with profound damage to his brain due to his addiction were able to observe healing after the man said ONE rosary...Imagine the healing that can occur with daily rosaries, the sacraments, talk therapy, and as needed the RECLAiM program!
