NOTE FROM FATHER CRAIG TIMMERMAN...

Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. This is THE defining moment of Jesus' public life. We hear the Father's voice speak truth to Jesus and to us: "You are My Beloved Son. In you I am well pleased." I invite you to pray with these words, spoken directly to YOU! You have become the Father's beloved, in Christ. These words are Truth and Life. As I announced last weekend, we are kicking off our capital campaign for the roof project. Fr. Denny let you know this was coming. Our patches put on the last couple years are leaking again. We feel we need to do this project this summer. As I've mentioned, we are putting on a steel roof instead of shingles - the roof committee worked with RoofSpecs and is unanimous that this is best to protect our roof long-term. This will require a new layer underneath, and as you know steel will be much more expensive than shingles. So we have a large amount of funds to raise this winter, so we can move ahead yet this year. I asked you to pray to St. Joseph for this project - here is the Memorare prayer to St. Joseph. I ask you to pray it every day for Joseph to provide and take care of this project from start to finish this year. I ask you to start asking God what He desires you to give financially to this project. The Father will provide all we need to fix OUR roof. ORDER OF MASS - BAPTISM OF THE LORD

PROCESSION

OPENING HYMN

Baptized in water, sealed by the spirit, cleansed by the blood of Christ our King: heirs of salvation, trusting his promise, faithfully now God's praise we sing.

GREETING

Presider: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: **Amen.**

Presider: The Lord be with you. (or similar greeting)

People: **And with your spirit.**

PENITENTIAL RITE

Presider: Brethren (brothers and sisters), let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.

Option A: I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, (And striking their breast, they say:) through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Isaiah 55:1-11

Thus says the LORD: All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat; come, without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk! Why spend your money for what is not bread, your wages for what fails to satisfy? Heed me, and you shall eat well, you shall delight in rich fare. Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life. I will renew with you the everlasting covenant, the benefits assured to David. As I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander of nations, so shall you summon a nation you knew not, and nations that knew you not shall run to you, because of the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, who has glorified you. Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near. Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked man his thoughts; let him turn to the LORD for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. As high as the heavens are above the earth so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts. For just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats, so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it.

And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one who testifies, and the Spirit is truth. So there are three that testify, the Spirit, the water, and the blood, and the three are of one accord. If we accept human testimony, the testimony of God is surely greater. Now the testimony of God is this, that he has testified on behalf of his Son.

I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." It happened in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming up out of the water he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

Presider: The Gospel of the Lord.

HOMILY

THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all

things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *(At the words that follow, up to and including 'and became man', all bow.)* and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

People: **Amen.**

SIGN OF PEACE

Presider: The peace of the Lord be with you always.

People: **And with your spirit.**

LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Presider: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

People: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

COMMUNION

For those not Catholic or otherwise unable to receive the Eucharist for whatever reason, please feel free to remain in your seat, or come forward with your arms across your chest, and Father will offer a blessing instead.

People: Amen.

Presider: Go in peace. (Or similar dismissal)

People: Thanks be to God.
