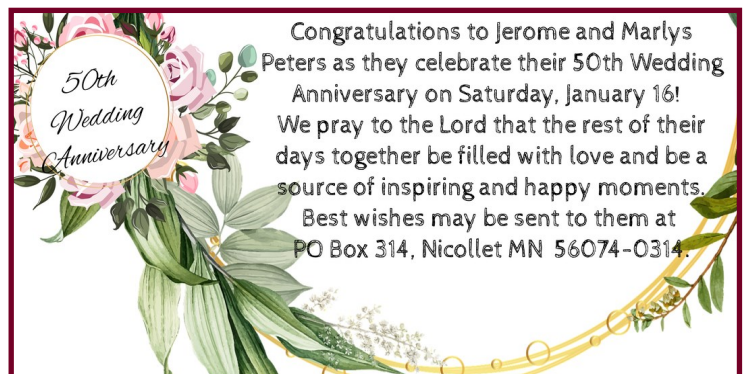

### NOTE FROM FATHER CRAIG TIMMERMAN...

You are beloved!

Last weekend I announced a new capital campaign to raise funds for a new steel roof. I emphasized that the Church really is our home, and this is our roof. It's been good making some phone calls and having the chance to talk to people, some who I haven't been able to meet in person yet. And the reality is, we need a roof, so I have to ask for the money for it! You should have received a letter in the mail this week. Please consider it with prayer. While our goal, 1.4 Million dollars, is a HUGE savings of what we expected (over 2 million), it is a hefty goal! What is the largest donation you could make at this time? I think it is often easy to think, 'Oh, I will give \$####. That is good enough.' But if this is truly your roof, what would you be spending to fix it? That is my point – it IS your/our roof. As part of God's family, we can't meet and worship, teach and sanctify without a good roof over our heads! The talk I gave on the roof last weekend is posted on our Facebook page, as well as a pledge form and my notes. If you go to the page where you watch the livestream, you can find it there!

Please be generous – I promise you, the return is always greater, because the Lord can never be outdone in generosity!

As we return to ordinary time, we are in the Year of the Gospel of Mark, and will read from Mark most of the Sundays of Ordinary Time. Since Mark is the shortest Gospel, the Church also weaves in some verses from the Gospel of John, so that we read all the Gospels over 3 years. So today we begin with Jesus' public ministry in the Gospel of John. The first followers went and spent the day with Jesus. Think about doing this every day this week: spend your day with Jesus today. Being with Jesus is what brings us peace. Being with Jesus is what heaven will be forever. By faith, we really can be with Jesus today. He says, "Come and see, come and spend the day with me today!" You are beloved!

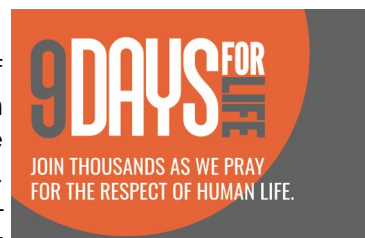

# ORDER OF MASS - 2ND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

## PROCESSION

### OPENING HYMN

God, we praise You! God, we bless you! God, we name you sov'reign Lord! Mighty King whom angels worship, Father, by your church adored. All creation shows your glory, heav'n and earth draw near your throne, singing "Holy, holy, holy, Lord of hosts, and God alone!"

### GREETING

Presider: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: **Amen.**

Presider: The Lord be with you. (or similar greeting)

People: **And with your spirit.**

### PENITENTIAL RITE

Presider: Brethren (brothers and sisters), let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.

*Option A:* I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, (And striking their breast, they say:) through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Presider: May Almighty God...R: **Amen.**

*Option B:*

V. Lord, have mercy. **R. Lord, have mercy.**

V. Christ, have mercy. **R. Christ, have mercy.**

V. Lord, have mercy. **R. Lord, have mercy.**

### GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

## LITURGY OF THE WORD

### FIRST READING

*1 Samuel 3:3-10, 19*

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

### RESPONSORIAL PSALM

*Psalms 40*

Refrain: **Here I am, Lord, here I am. I come to do your will.**

Brothers and sisters: The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with him. Avoid immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore glorify God in your body.

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

Presider: The Gospel of the Lord.

## **HOMILY**

### **THE NICENE CREED**

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all

things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *(At the words that follow, up to and including 'and became man', all bow.)* and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

People: **Amen.**

#### **SIGN OF PEACE**

Presider: The peace of the Lord be with you always.

People: **And with your spirit.**

#### **LAMB OF GOD**

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

#### **INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

For those not Catholic or otherwise unable to receive the Eucharist for whatever reason, please feel free to remain in your seat, or come forward with your arms across your chest, and Father will offer a blessing instead.

People: Amen.
