

Dear Parishioners.

Happy Catholic Schools week. We are blessed to have a Catholic School here in our Area Faith Community. Catholic Schools provide such a richness to the parish. Following are the prayers that were recommended during the Parish Mission.

RELEASING OF REVENGEFUL EMOTIONS PRAYER

(Start with anger and work your way through each emotion)

"Holy Spirit, Shine the light of your love into my heart and reveal to me the emotions of (Anger, Hatred, Resentment, Criticism, Judgment) that I might be harboring towards You, others or myself.

(Wait as the HS reveals to you the first emotion of anger. As you grab it, hold onto it, see who it is directed towards, actually feel that emotion and when you are ready to let it go pray:)

"Jesus, I relinquish control of this _____ toward _____, please take it away. Go back and look for it. (Emotion) (Name)

Notice it is gone. Wait there for the next emotion to surface. You will no when you are done with a particular emotion when no more surface and you experience peace and calm.

Judgments Prayer – The pray is slightly different for the emotion of Judgment.

"Jesus, This day I choose to forgive _____, please take this judgment away. (Name)

**Remember that these emotions are there because of another wound. Now that you have removed these you are free to ask the HS to reveal to you the real wounds that motivated you to put up these emotional walls.


Forgiveness is never dependent on a feeling. It is an act of love and therefore can be exercised anytime you want. Forgiveness is always the beginning of healing! If you want to heal from the deeper wounds begin with getting rid of the revengeful emotions and forgiving those who hurt you. Then you will be free to see the truth the Lord wants to show you. Until you let go of those, He can't help you because those emotional walls keep Jesus out!

CONSCIOUSNESS EXAMEN

This is normally done at the end of the day, or several times throughout the day. It is a method to help one to become more aware of God's presence throughout the day. It is not about seeking forgiveness as the Examination of Conscience, about of become aware of God in the activity of the day by reflecting on where He was active with you.

- 1. **Thanksgiving:** Lord, I realize that all, even myself, is a gift from you.
- Today, for what things am I most grateful?
- 2. **Intention:** Lord, open my eyes and ears to be more honest with myself.
- Today, what do I really want for myself?
- 3. **Examination:** Lord, show me what has been happening to me and in me this day.
- Today, in what ways have I experienced your love?
- 4. **Contrition:** Lord, I am still learning to grow in your love.
- Today, what choices have been inadequate responses to your love?
- 5. **Hope:** Lord, let me look with longing toward the future.
- Today, how will I let you lead me to a brighter tomorrow?


