Dear Parishioners,

Next weekend, we will be hosting Fr. Irenaeus and Fr. Cornelius, who are currently serving our Diocese for 5 years while speaking about the mission of their home diocese in Nigeria. We will have a second collection for our annual Mission cooperative, and your generous support is appreciated. I was originally scheduled to be directing a retreat next weekend, but it has been cancelled due to lack of other team and retreatants, so I will be at St. Peter's Masses and a meeting.

Our readings this weekend speak about prayer. It is a timely message, especially as we see so much chaos around us. We have terrorists using guns, bombs, and trucks to kill and maim. Instead of waiting for the facts, and making reasonable and appropriate responses, some have redefined 'justice' into vengeance, which they then take into their own hands. We assume the worst of intentions into tense interactions. We allow minute differences to define away all commonalities. We demonize others, all the while holding ourselves above criticism.

In the end, the only thing that will change all of it is a conversion of hearts which begins in encountering the Lord in prayer. We must start assuming charity on the part of others, which comes only when we know the Lord has been so good to us, which is affirmed in prayer. It continues when we realize that there is evil in the world, but to battle it, we do not battle flesh and blood, and certainly not with weapons of death, but that our battle is with the prince of lies, Satan Himself. The weapons that win that battle are spiritual - the Rosary, Scripture reading and rote prayers, contemplation and adoration, blessed medals and scapulars (not worn as talismans or magic charms, but as reminders that our strength is in God alone). Yes, the battlefield is our hearts, and the war is waged in prayer. Are we heeding this call? Are we praying for our world, country, state, counties, cities, neighborhoods, homes and families? Are we, especially men, following the example of Abraham and Moses in standing in the breach between God and humanity pleading for clemency? In the coming months, men of our parishes will be invited to discern their place in the battle against Satan through the Catholic Watchmen. I invite and encourage all men to join us in adoration on Friday evenings at 11 pm (we just rescheduled it for then). I am sure that some might label me as reactionary or over-the-top, but I am more convinced that until we understand Satan's tactics and attacks, we will see greater atrocities. There is no better time than in this Year of Mercy than to beg for that mercy to be poured out.
