A NOTE FROM FATHER

Dear Parishioners,

Thursday of this week is the 13th day, and it was one hundred years ago on this day that the Blessed Mother gave the shepherd children at Fatima a vision of hell that terrified them to the core. She reminded them of the reality of hell, worse than our imaginations can grasp. In subsequent photos of the visionaries, their countenance is subdued, almost dour. A vision of hell would do that! At the same time, Sr. Lucia stated "How can we ever be grateful enough to our kind heavenly Mother, who had already prepared us by promising, in the first Apparition, to take us to heaven. Otherwise, I think we would have died of fear and terror." The Blessed mother encouraged praying the rosary, the wearing of the Scapular, and prayers of conversion. One such prayer often added to the end of each decade in reciting the rosary, is simple in words but packed in meaning.

O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those most in need of Thy mercy. Amen. As someone who prays the rosary daily, I cannot begin to tell you what an effect it has had on my life. Asking the Blessed Mother's intercession, to be with me as I serve and pray for you... She comes through. I humbly encourage all of us to pray the rosary frequently, daily if possible. I also humbly encourage the wearing of the Brown Scapular (Our Lady of Mount Carmel). This is not a magically thing or a talisman. I tis a humble reminder and a symbol of a promise that we made to God through the Blessed Mother to live a life in conformity to the Gospel, and that the Blessed Mother would aid us when in most need, especially at the hour of death. I will offer an opportunity for investiture next Sunday following the 10 am for those that wish. I have a good number of scapulars, but I want to be certain to have enough so I need to know by July 10th.


