OUR MISSION STATEMENT: Growing In Faith Together (G.I.F.T.)

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you to all who took time to pray and be emerged in the Lord's Mercy this weekend with the "24 Hours with the Lord." I hope that this 'project' will bear fruit in the weeks to come.

This weekend we hear the Parable of the Prodigal Son. In it, we hear the son's realization how far from his father he has gone - from being a beloved son that the father would grant even an insulting request, to someone longing to eat pig food in a distant land far away. But we might miss the other point of the story, too, is that the older son is just as far from his father - he does not recognize the love that the father has for him at all. The point of this parable is to move us to contrition, which is not just a feeling of sorrow for our sins but also a realization of the love of God for us. Contrition means "ground to pieces" and it is when we are truly contrite that God can begin to remake us. Contrition then that is only expressed, only felt as a feeling of sorrow, is empty. Contrition means to get up and go back to the Father. When we do, we find the Father watching and waiting for us, running toward us and restoring the dignity we gave up in our sins. How lovely is that!

The fourth Spiritual Work of Mercy is to bear wrongs patiently. On its first read, this runs contrary to the world. We are called to live justly, and we ought to expect justice. But note that this work is not to allow injustice. The key is 'patiently' - that we treat the wrong doer with mercy, that we have instructed them of the sin, or pointed out the error, but that we endure it patiently - to tolerate the delay of justice with the Lord's aid. This is an act of mercy to the other - it is giving them opportunity to see the injustice and to respond on their own. This work is needed when people say harsh things about us, when the wheels of gossip turn.
