

Dear Parishioners,

Our deepest sympathy to the family and friends of Jerry Lager. May his soul, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.

This weekend we celebrate Mother's Day. I hope it is a day of rest and respect for all mothers, grandmothers, and motherly women of our parishes.

Last week, it was announced that on the 13th day of the months of May through October of this year, faithful can receive a plenary indulgence (a full release from the temporal punishments of their sins) on the normal conditions (prayer for the Pope, Reception of the Eucharist, and Confession), by visiting an image of Our Lady of Fatima and praying an Our Father, the Creed, and invoking Our Lady of Fatima. This is because it is the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of the Blessed Mother to three children Jacinta and Francisco Marto and Lucia Santos in Fatima, Portugal. Our Lady begged for them to pray the rosary everyday for world peace (World War I had just broken out), wear the brown Scapular, and seek to have Russia converted to the Immaculate Heart. The final Apparition on October 13, 1917, a profound miracle occurred in which thousands of people witnessed a miracle of the sun 'dancing' in the sky, changing colors. This was witnessed miles away and reported in secular (and atheistic) papers. Both Jacinta and Francisco died before 1920, while Lucia entered the Dorothean order and later the Carmelites and died February 13, 2005 (just a few months before St. John Paul II). The story of Fatima and the apparitions is fascinating, but for a quick primer, I can think of anything better than recommending the movie, "The 13th Day". It just focuses on the apparitions, without mentioning the preliminary apparitions of an angel tasked with preparing the children.

During these next 6 months, I encourage you to pray the Rosary, invoking Our Lady of Fatima, reading of the apparitions, and seeking holiness. For what it is worth, I cannot recommend FatimaCrusader.com, however, as there are a few statements that directly contradict Sr. Lucia and St. John Paul II. ~In Christ, Fr. Todd


