## NOTE FROM FATHER PHIL...

Hello and Blessings to all of you from a former pastor and Mission Director for the Diocese of New Ulm,

This Sunday, October 18<sup>th</sup> is World Mission Sunday...a day to remember that our little corner of the world and the particular challenges that we face daily are a tiny slice of the experience of our larger human family. As followers of Christ our concern goes out to all who hunger literally for bread and hunger spiritually for the message of saving love that comes from the proclamation of the "Good news".



Therefore, as Mission Director for the Diocese I would like to share with you (a bit on the lighter side) an experience I had a couple weeks ago: I awoke in the middle of the night with what I honestly felt was an invitation from the Lord to go golfing together! Seriously! Let me explain.. On July 1<sup>st</sup> of this year I semi-retired (rewired) as a pastor, which has allowed me a little more time to go golfing. My game has improved a little.

Since everything is related to everything else, I felt the Lord was inviting me to go golfing with the benefit going to the Missions. After all, if I can afford to go golfing I can also afford to give to the Missions. Therefore, my initial "pledge" was an amount per stroke that I thought was generous, based on my very best score ever, which, I must admit I had, not so secretly, hoped everybody would find out about.

The catch was that any strokes over that all-time-low would also "have" to be paid, per stroke, depending on whether the Lord thought I was generous enough!! I was a bit concerned that the Lord might address not only my sense of generosity but also my pride as we play the course. Perhaps some old, bad habits would return or the silly little ball might just head more often toward the rough or the water or out of bounds. Even more worrisome is the reality that if you are playing with the Lord you have to play strictly by the official rules and not by special priest's rules used on occasion in emergencies...

you know, like teeing it up in the impossible rough!! Anyway, we had a good game, the Lord and I. I was encouraged to be a bit more generous as is often the case with the Lord.

As you think about your donation to the Mission Sunday Collection, I thought you might enjoy this story...it really happened... and perhaps find your own way to go golfing with the Lord on behalf of the Missions.

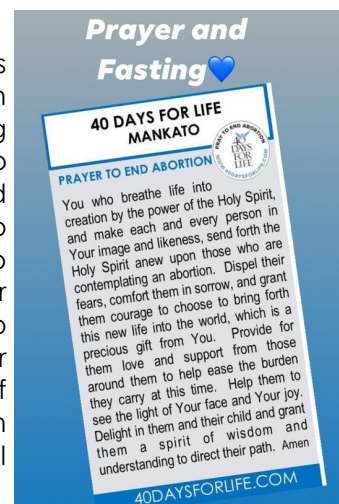
## NEWS FROM NICOLLET

- Applicants must also fill out our emergency assistance application. If an applicant is denied for emergency assistance, they may still qualify for our crisis funding program
- Applicants must have income below 275% of the federal poverty guidelines
- Program ends November 15, 2020

## ORDER OF MASS - 29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### PROCESSION

#### GREETING

Presider: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: **Amen.**
